

Primary Sports Premium Statement 2015-16

Amount of Grant Received: £8,144

Coaching

We have used some of the funding to employ specialist coaches who delivers 2x 1/2 day curriculum PE to years 2,3,4,5 and 6. They also provide 5 after school clubs.

We rate the quality of the sessions as good.

Competition

This year there has been a 75% increase in competition and event participation.

The children have taken part in the following competitions and events:

We have achieved the School Games Kite Mark at a bronze level and are working on our silver award.

Health and Physical activity

We have taken part in the British Heart Foundation skipping day. We are awaiting a bag to start our club which we will probably incorporate into our new breakfast club. We are currently surveying our pupils to find out what activities they take part in outside of school. We will be setting up a sports club for 2 weeks of the summer holidays and 1 week of the Easter holidays on the Junior site.

Professional Learning

We have had 2 teachers attending training on handball and have used support from our Sports Partnership School to access additional equipment and expertise. We continue to buy into the Mandeville School Sports partnership and have strong links with Sir Henry Floyd Grammar School.

A nominated TA organises sports fixtures and liaises with the Deputy head to co ordinate sports activities for all pupils.

Our Kst 2 sports leaders have had training form Sir Henry Floyd and manage sports activities for the younger pupils.

We are also a member of Aylesbury Vale Primary Schools Athletic Association and have taken part in cross Country events.

Other

We have bought new PE equipment for both sites to enable more pupils to be active during PE lessons and it increases the range of sports we can offer.

We have swimming in yrs 2,3 and 4- each class goes for a term. We use our funding to pay for Pupil Premium pupils. These pupils also participate in after school sports clubs for free as this is subsidised by the school.

We have also linked with local school to promote sport and have set up our own sports partnership offer activities across schools- HASSP (Haddenham Area School Sports Partnership). We have a website and also promote local sports clubs. We hope to use this forum to provide inter-school activities on a termly basis. Currently Haddenham Junior, Haddenham Infant, Haddenham St Marys, Cuddington and Dinton c of E and Great Kimble Infant are involved.

We have our Gold Kite mark for Sports and were runners up in the Bucks and Milton Keynes Primary School Sports award.

Impact of Pupil Participation

All Kst 2 pupils have 2 hours of curriculum PE a week. Kst 1 and Foundation have a minimum of 1 1/2 hours.

We offer 5 hours of extra curricular sports in the form of after school clubs- this has increased by 1/3 since September 2012. In addition we offer 2 lunchtime dance clubs and opportunities to take part in sports fixtures and competitions.

We have a Sports Leaders Programme where pupils take responsibility for assisting in running a club and supervising the younger children's sporting activities on both sites. We have approached pupils who are reluctant in sport to help the younger children, this has developed greater confidence and participation for both groups- those leading and those taking part.

We have a weekly award for Sports Person of the Week. This can be for achievement, participation or supporting others. We also keep a 'wall of fame' for those children who share their sporting achievements from outside of school. After each match the children read a match report at the sharing assembly on a Friday. These will be put up on the website.

There are designated areas for different sporting activities. We are currently in the process of developing the outside area:

Junior site	trim-trail on the field and bike racks outside the front of the school (Race 4 Space, Parish donation) September 2014
Infant field	outside adventure equipment (Race 4 Space) October 2014
Foundation area	resurfacing outside space to allow for all weather play (Lottery Grant)
Infant Playground	resurfacing, marking and hard standing play equipment (Lottery Grant) October 2014

The Race 4 Space money was originally raised to provide changing rooms on the Junior site. It became apparent that after the school redevelopment these were no longer needed and the money was diverted to provide secure, hard standing play equipment for the children on both sites.

We have gone from 50% participation in extra curricular sports in 2012 to 240% participation because many children are choosing to do more than 1 activity.

Our school values link very closely to all subject areas, including PE. In awarding Sports certificates staff and pupils will often use the values to express their achievement.

Through work on science, PE and PHSE, Pupils are aware of the need for exercise and healthy life styles. Sponsored events for charities, such as the British Heart Foundation, underpinned this teaching.
