Dear Parents,

With Parents evening next week I thought it would be appropriate for me to outline the information that will be shared with you at this event.

As you are aware the way we report progress and assessment data to you has changed. We have adopted the phrases: emerging (below National expectation at this point), expected (at expected level at this point) and exceeding (above national expectation at this point). No levels will be given.

It is important that you recognise the information is based on where your child is in the autumn term with regards to what has been taught. Please remember that they have accessed less than one third of the new annual curriculum.

It may be that your child was “exceeding” at the end of last year and is now “emerging” at the beginning of their current year. This is because they will not have accessed the curriculum at their current level; it does not mean there has been a decline in their learning. Our expectation for all children is that, if they finish a year at “expected”, they will finish their following year at “expected” or better, likewise for “exceeding”. This will show expected or maintained levels of progress.

Mr Tomson and I will be holding a parent workshop entitled ‘Assessment Developments’ on Thursday 26th November to explore this further. It will be great to see you there.

Celebration Assemblies

In the Friday collective worship we celebrate children's achievements both in and out of school by awarding certificates and sharing awards which children have brought in.

With so many children taking part in sporting, musical and pastime events outside of school it is becoming very difficult to include everything the children want to share; it is also difficult to know how recent or how significant the achievement is without something for the children to show and talk about. The length of the assembly and the required attention span is now having an impact on the children's behaviour and learning time.

From now on, in order to keep the assembly to a reasonable length, only children who have a medal, certificate or trophy will be able to share their achievement in the whole site assemblies. If your child forgets the certificate etc. they will need to wait until the following week when they can have another opportunity. If it is not an event or occasion which provides a certificate etc. then it could be shared in class with the agreement of the class teacher.

We are very proud of everything our pupils take part in and achieve and, although this is a wonderful problem to have, we must prioritise our learning time in lessons.
