

Autumn Term Heroes and Villains

This term the children will be crossing lines between reality and fantasy when we look at real and fictional heroes and villains. We will be closely studying Harry Potter, The Prisoner of Azkaban. The text will give the class ample opportunities to discuss the themes of friendship, justice and morality. Art will drive the first half term. The children will use Roy Lichentstein's pop art as a stimulus and create themselves as pop art! Design and technology will lead us into Autumn term two and we will be planning, designing and decorating a highwayman's mask, based on The Highwayman by Alfred Noves. The poem is notable for the way in which it reverses our expectations concerning light and dark imagery, inspiring powerful persuasive writing and descriptive narratives.

Spring Term Victorian Schools

The children will be going back in time for our Spring term. They will begin the year with an immersive architecture workshop where they will be recreating Crystal Palace in our school hall!

Our main text will be Street Child by Berlie Doherty.

This text is a fictional account of the experiences of Jim Jarvis, a young orphan who escapes the workhouse in 1860's London and survives brutal treatment and desperate circumstances until he is taken in by Dr. Barnardo, founder of a school for the city's "ragged" children.

Over the term, the children will be using the text to inspire their writing of different genres such as: biography, narrative, poetry and argument. For Art, DT and Computing, the children will be designing and making models for a Victorian street scene. They will then be creating and filming an animation using their creations.

Summer Vive la France

This term we will be celebrating everything French including a fantastic outward bounds activity week where the children will be showing their resilience, belief and integrity through a wide range of challenges. The children will be exploring the human and physical geography of France as well as the impact of its culture upon the world. Children will practise their French speaking skills in the classroom, ordering foods from a boulangerie; in preparation for their residential: ordering their own foods in the local town.

As the count-down to Japan 2020 continues, we will research and analyse Olympic sports and the core values of the Olympic traditions. Year 6 children will take part in the Young Enterprise Fiver Challenge, whilst year 5 polish their word processing skills.
