Dear Parents and Carers,

Following Parent Forum last Friday, I felt it was important to clarify a couple of things:

Government Announcements

School has no knowledge of what is going to be announced until the same time as everybody else; we are given no prior notice. The Chair of Governors, Mrs Wilde, Mr Jackson and myself have planned for many different scenarios, but until the Government issues new guidance they remain as plans. The two key dates that we are all waiting for are 17th May and 21st June. I hope that from the 17th May it will be possible to take children off site for day visits and from 21st June restrictions will be lifted. After these dates, and when Government guidance is issued, I will let you know if there are any changes in school.

'Bubbles' in school

The Infant site will remain as one bubble with collection from the Churchyard until at least 21st June. The Junior site will remain as two bubbles, with phased pick up and drop off and collection from the school field until at least 21st June.

The Government guidance allows us to have mixed bubbles for all after school provision, both indoors and out. We have tried, where possible, to maintain the bubbles for after school sports clubs, but this is not possible for Night Owls on the Junior site.

Planned Events

This is very difficult for all schools. We hope to be able to offer all our usual Summer term events: - Leavers show and Leavers service for year 6, Sports day, Summer dancing, Music performances, Alice in Wonderland performance from year 5 & 6, in person fund raising activities for F4CADs, trips etc. However, we will not be able to share any dates with you until things are confirmed and/or we have guidance from the Government and Public Health.

The staff, Governors and I are as frustrated as you that we can't get 'back to normal' more quickly. But we must continue to follow the Government guidance and keep as safe as possible so that the expected changes can happen on the key dates of 17th May and 21st June.

- Carpets, rugs and mats (including bath, shower and toilet mats)
- Soiled, painted, ripped or wet clothing
- School uniforms with and without logo
- Corporate clothing and workwear
- Textile off cuts, yarns or threaded material

Mobile phones in school and on the bus

Children are only allowed to have mobile phones in school with prior agreement for exceptional circumstances. Children should not have mobile phones in their bags to be used on the school bus.

TicToc

Just a reminder that TicToc should only be used by children over the age of 13. This week I have had to deal with children singing inappropriate songs that they have viewed on TicToc.
