Safeguarding

Did you know that DSL stands for Designated Safeguarding Lead. At Cuddington and Dinton we have three DSL's: Mrs Wilde, Mrs Thomas and Mrs Bowman who take the lead responsibility for monitoring safeguarding, child protection and online safety. The DSLs at our school wear an orange lanyard to make them easily identifiable.

Message from the Governors

In the last few newsletters, we have explained who we are and how we operate as a board. We thought it may be useful to explain a little more about our school and how the type of school impacts how a governing body functions.

In towns and villages across England there are several different types of primary or community schools. A 'C of E School' is an abbreviation for a Church of England School meaning the ethos of the school is rooted in Christian values, is supported by local churches and in our case the Oxford Diocese (which supports 284 schools).

A majority of the governing board are foundation governors appointed by local churches to support the Christian foundation of the school. There are two types of state funded faith schools; Voluntary Controlled (VC) schools which are managed and funded by Bucks local authority and Voluntary Aided (VA) schools like ours. These have far more autonomy; in determining values and ethos, in employing and managing staff, as an admission authority and having capital funding responsibility. Our governors are all very mindful of these extra responsibilities that they have and work very hard behind the scenes to support Mrs Wilde and all the staff at the school.
